Creation or Evolution



The Halifax Rules

as recorded by James Power:

- 1. The game was played with a block of wood for a puck.
- 2. The puck was not allowed to leave the ice.
- 3. The stones marking the place to score goals were placed on the ice (at right angles to those at present) parallel to the sides of the ice surface.
- 4. There was to be no slashing.
- 5. There was to be no lifting the stick above the shoulder.
- 6. When a goal was scored, teams changed ends
- 7. Players had to keep 'on side' of the puck.
- 8. The 'forward pass' was permitted.
- 9. All players played the entire game.
- 10. There was a no-replacement rule for penalized players.
- 11. The game had two thirty minute periods with a ten minute break.
- 12. The goal-keeper had to stand for the entire game.
- 13. Goals were decided by the goal umpires, who stood at the goal mouth and rang a handbell.

In his own words, these were the rules used as Colonel Weston and his friends played the game in the mid 1800s.
